As a regional climate agency, TAF invests in low-carbon solutions for the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area and helps scale them up for broad implementation.






# What emissions are counted in the report?

### Total emissions by sector in the GTHA










Emissions from natural gas increased by 11% and account for 40% of total emissions

















# Emissions by municipality and sector
